



# 1. Change the planning approach to a strategic collaborative planning process


#### Comprehensive Land Use Approach

- · Complex information;
- High levels of understanding, evidence, planning and technology;
- · Expensive;
- · Time consuming;
- Easier for those with time and money to participate; and
- Does not incorporate social and economic well.

#### Strategic Land Use Approach

- · Broad and diverse involvement;
- · Long term vision;
- · Builds on agreement;
- · Collaborative;
- · Generates understanding;
- Good planning process for economic and social priorities;
- · Integrated development; and
- · Flexible and adaptive.

5. A common process for gathering, presenting and using information is required.




## 6. Clear and agreed to understanding of the roles and responsibilities
